


Directors received reports on MLS Evolved, MLS Committee, and the NAR Convention.

At the Annual Meeting in October, RAYAC membership voted to proceed with joining the consolidated MLS Evolved efforts - **now known as Bright MLS.** RAYAC and the other participating organizations are continuing to meet to finalize many aspects of the new organization including legal documentation.

At their December Board of Directors meeting, the RAYAC Board of Directors needs to appoint one RAYAC member to serve on the Bright MLS Board of Directors.

Bright MLS Board of Directors Meeting Information and Time Commitment:

- The Board member needs to have an active Pennsylvania Real Estate License.
- The Board member needs to be a Primary member of RAYAC and be a member in good standing.
- The Bright MLS Board of Directors will meet 4-6 times a year.
- The Bright MLS Board meetings will be held in Baltimore.
- The meeting expenses (travel, hotel, etc) for board members will be paid by Bright MLS.
- The term for a board member is a three-year commitment.
- The first Bright Board of Directors Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 10, 2017 in Baltimore.



Major Trade Groups Urge Congress to Renew Two Major Homeowner Tax Provisions

The National Association of REALTORS® recently joined with the Mortgage Bankers Association and National Association of Home Builders to urge Congress to renew two key tax provisions for homeowners. The coalition has written a joint letter to leaders in the House and Senate asking them to act on both the Mortgage Debt Forgiveness provision and a provision that allows a tax deduction for mortgage insurance premiums. Following are comments from each letter sent to Congress:

- Mortgage Debt Forgiveness Provision: The first provision ensures that any mortgage debt that is forgiven by a lender in connection with a principal residence will continue to be excluded from the taxable income of the borrower. This prevents "underwater" homeowners from being taxed if their lender reduces the principal balance or a portion of their mortgage debt is forgiven in connection with a so-called "short sale." If Congress fails to act, struggling homeowners who accept short sales or a loan modification offer could be faced with a substantial tax assessment. The current provision, if extended, would aid many loss mitigation efforts and provide borrowers with the certainty that they will not be faced with a large, unexpected tax bill.
- Mortgage Insurance Premium Deduction: We believe that Congress should extend the tax deduction for mortgage insurance premiums paid by homeowners. For a \$200,000 home, many homeowners are presently able to deduct between \$600 and \$1,000 from their taxes. Retaining this deduction beyond 2016 will greatly benefit the large number of homeowners, particularly first time home buyers, who cannot afford a 20% or greater down payment and who use mortgage insurance in order to purchase a home.
