


Strategic Discussion

We have scheduled a DR/Manager meeting on February 8th to present this information. We will then continue to gather information and present the information to the membership through a series of town hall meetings and other communication mediums.

There was fear over learning a completely new system, but at the same time there was excitement over new technology. So as we continue exploring this regionalization effort, I would encourage you to look at it with an open mind. Become informed. We are in the process of scheduling two town hall meetings for our members in March. Details on those events can be found on page 8 of the newsletter. I hope that I will see you there as we explore the ever changing future of our industry.

LICENSE RENEWAL INFORMATION

Deadline to complete continuing education and renew your real estate license with the SREC is May 31, 2016.

If a license is issued between December 1, 2013 and November 30, 2015, the licensee will need to complete the two state required courses by May 31, 2016 to renew.

The SREC Required Courses:

- 1. Real Estate Essentials 7 hr general module
- 2. Choice of: Residential Real Estate 101 or Commercial Real Estate 101 7 hr specific module

If a license is issued between December 1, 2015 and February 29, 2016, the licensee will need to renew the license by May 31, 2016, but will be exempt from CE.

Egislative Link

The City of York has sent notification to the York City School District that they will begin collecting their portion of the realty transfer tax. Here is what you, the REALTOR, need to know.

In York and Adams Counties there is a 2% realty transfer tax collected on property sales. Of that 2% collected, 1% is a state realty transfer tax and the tax revenue is placed in the Pennsylvania general assembly funds. The other 1% is a local realty transfer tax that is shared equally between the school district and the municipality.

That was the case everywhere in York and Adams Counties with the exception of the City of York. There was a gentleman's agreement made some time ago between the school district and the city that the city would not collect their portion of the realty transfer tax, allowing the school district to collect the full 1% local realty transfer tax.

The City of York's announcement will not increase the realty transfer tax that is collected on property sales. It will only change how the funds are distributed. Like others sales in our two-county area, now the 1% local realty transfer tax will be shared equally between the city and the school district. This will be a tax revenue gain for the City of York and a tax revenue loss for the School District. It is projected that this will be a \$150,000 in revenue loss this budget cycle (through June 30) and a \$300,000 loss in the 2016-2017 budget cycle for the school district.

Practicing Professionalism

Ombudsman Services

RAYAC is charged with the responsibility of receiving and resolving ethics complaints. Many "complaints" received do not expressly allege violations of specific Articles of the Code of Ethics, and many do not detail conduct related to the Code. Some "complaints" are actually transactional, technical, or procedural questions readily responded to. Ethics complaints might be averted with enhanced communications and initial problem-solving capacity of the ombudsman.

Role of Ombudsmen

The ombudsman's role is primarily one of communication and conciliation, not adjudication. Ombudsmen do not determine whether ethics violations have occurred, rather they anticipate, identify, and resolve misunderstandings and disagreements before matters ripen into disputes and possible charges of unethical conduct
