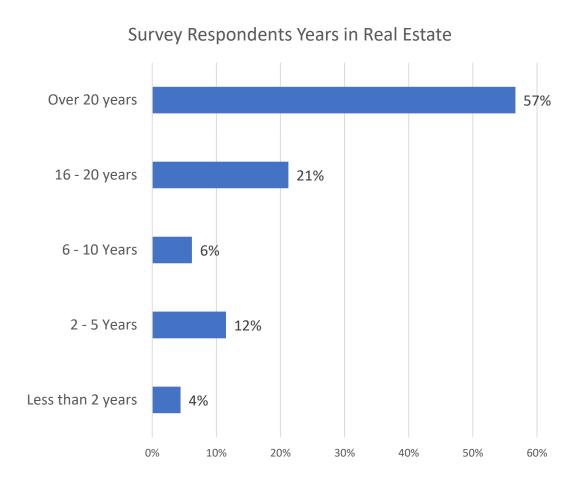

RAYAC Market Features Member Survey

- In November of 2019, the REALTORS®
 Association of York & Adams Counties partnered with Strategic Guidance Systems to conduct a member wide survey on the market features of properties by specific price range. The survey was completed by 113 RAYAC members.
- More than 90% of members reported selling and appraising homes in the \$125,000 to \$300,000 price range.
- Nearly 2/3 of members reported selling homes at price ranges ranging from \$350,000-\$500,000.
- 88% of respondents are real estate licensees, 5% are appraisal certificate holders and 7% of respondents are both.

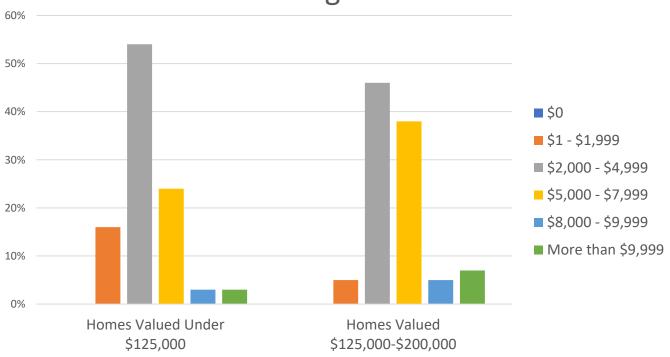


Top 5 Features Home Buyers Want in a Home

- Fenced-In Yard-10% of Respondents

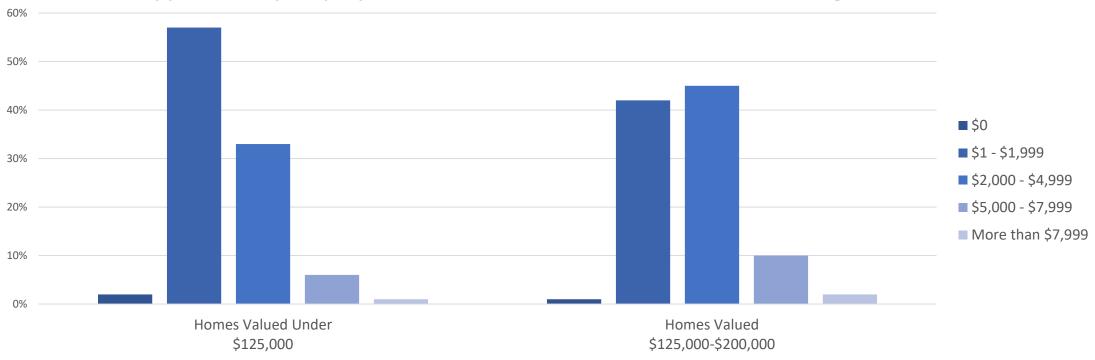
Full Bathrooms in homes valued up to \$200,000

Assuming a house has one full bathroom, how much would a typical buyer pay for an additional bathroom above grade?



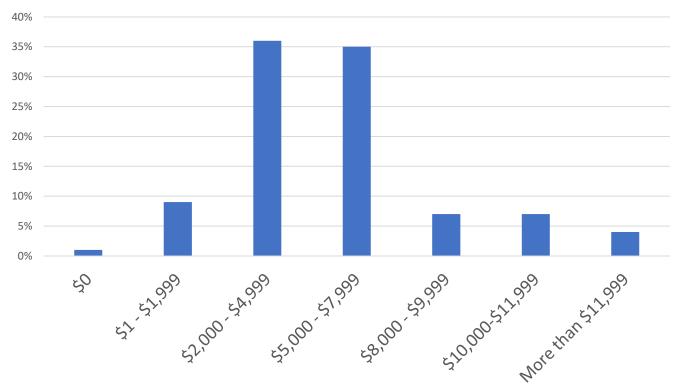
Half Baths in homes valued up to \$200,000

Assuming a house has one full bathroom, how much would a typical buyer pay for an additional **half bath** above grade?



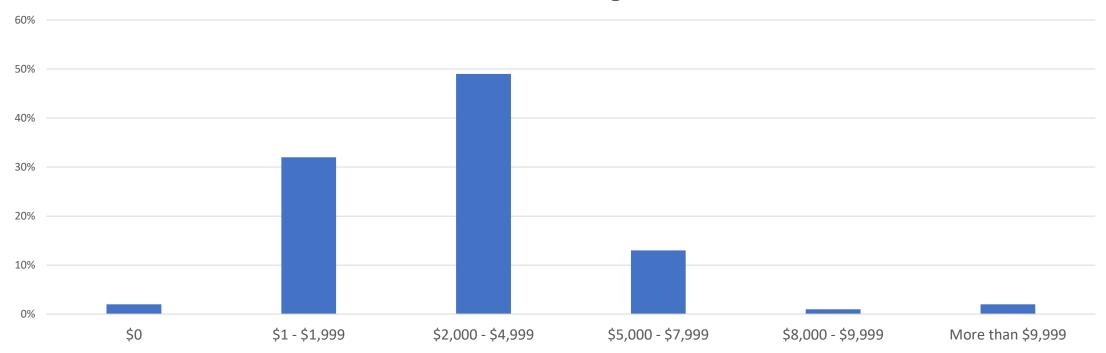

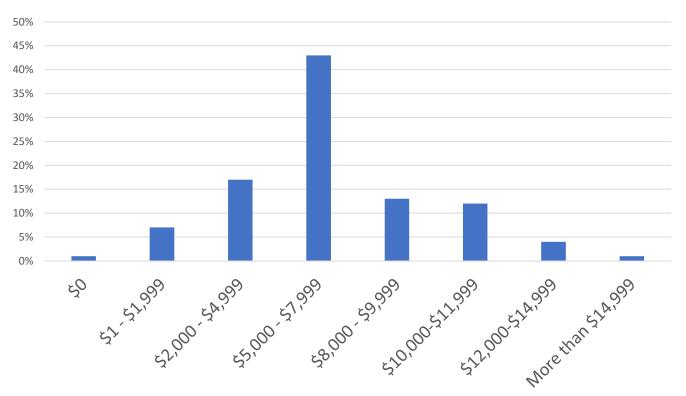
Half Baths in Homes Valued between \$200,000-\$350,000

In the price range of \$200,000-\$350,000 assume a standard home has **two full** bathrooms above grade, how much would a typical buyer pay for an additional half bath above grade?



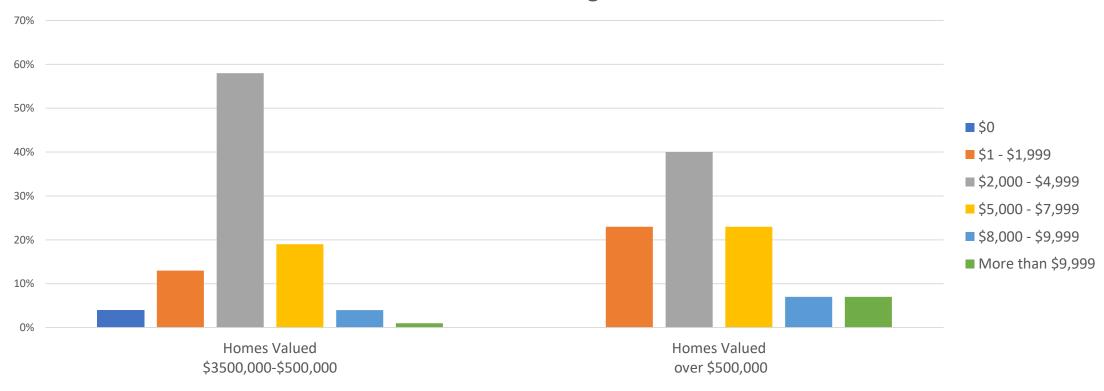
Full Bathrooms in homes valued \$350,000-\$500,000

In the price range of \$350,000-\$500,000, how much would the typical buyer pay for each additional full bathroom above grade over **2.5 baths**?



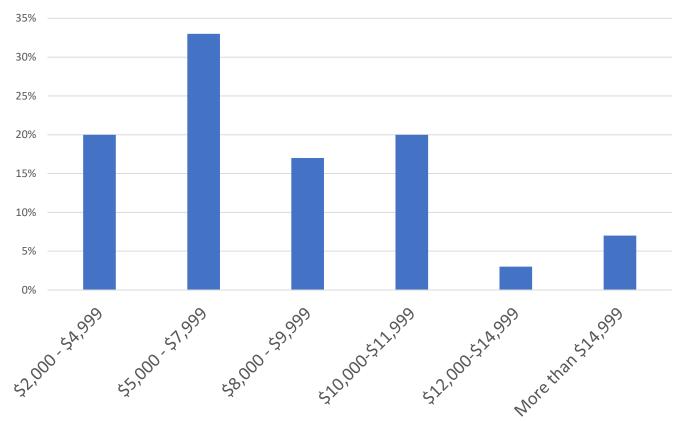
Half Bath in Homes Valued Over \$350,000

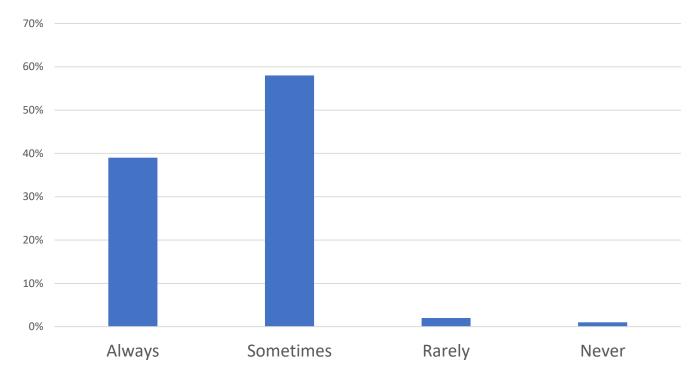

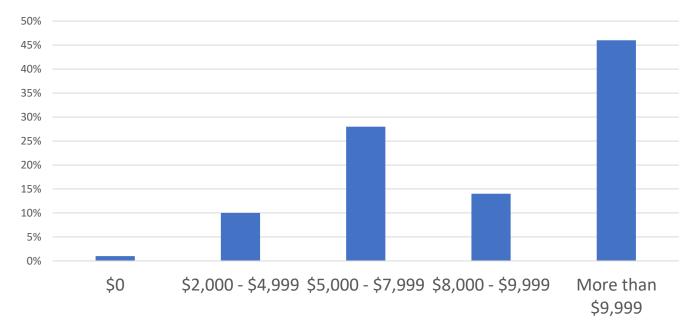

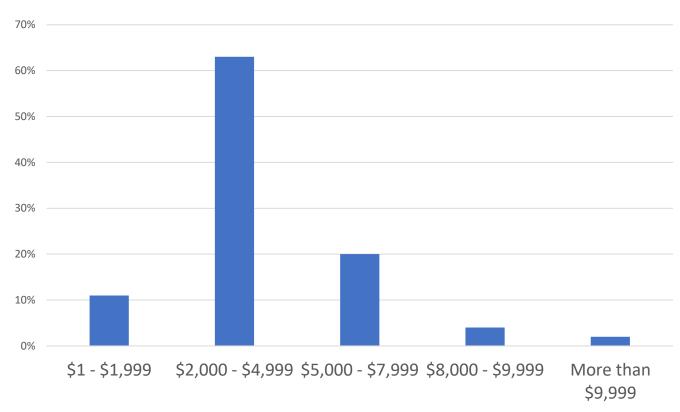

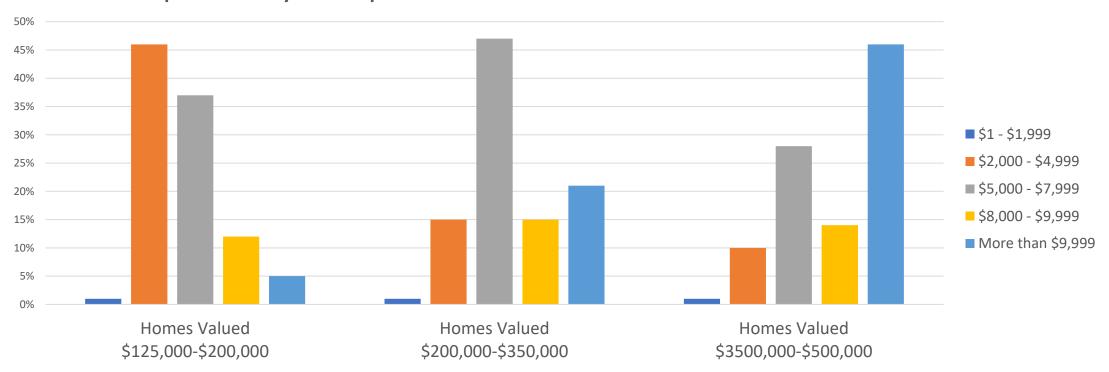

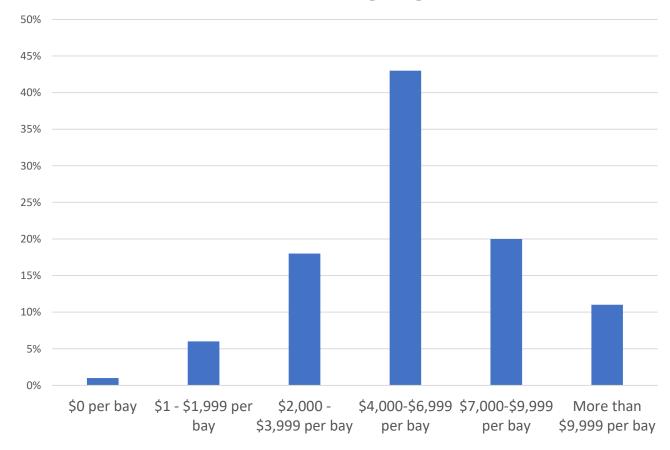

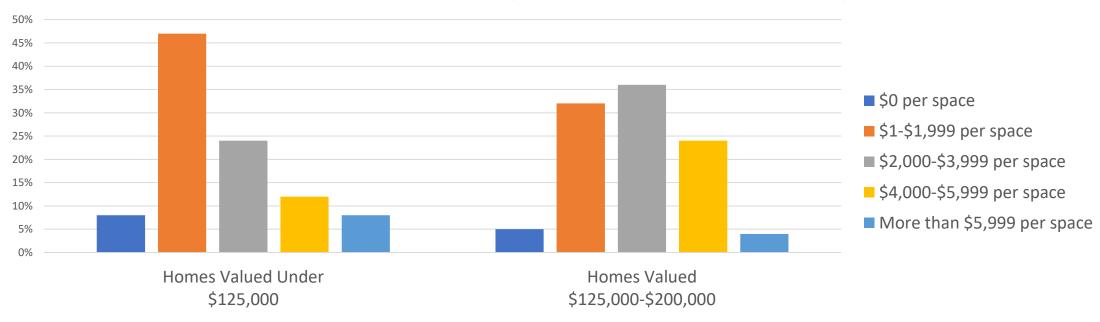

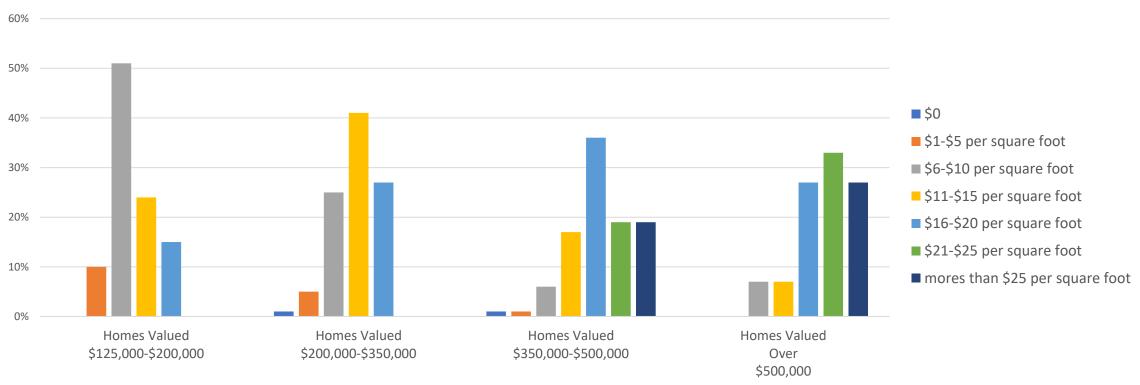

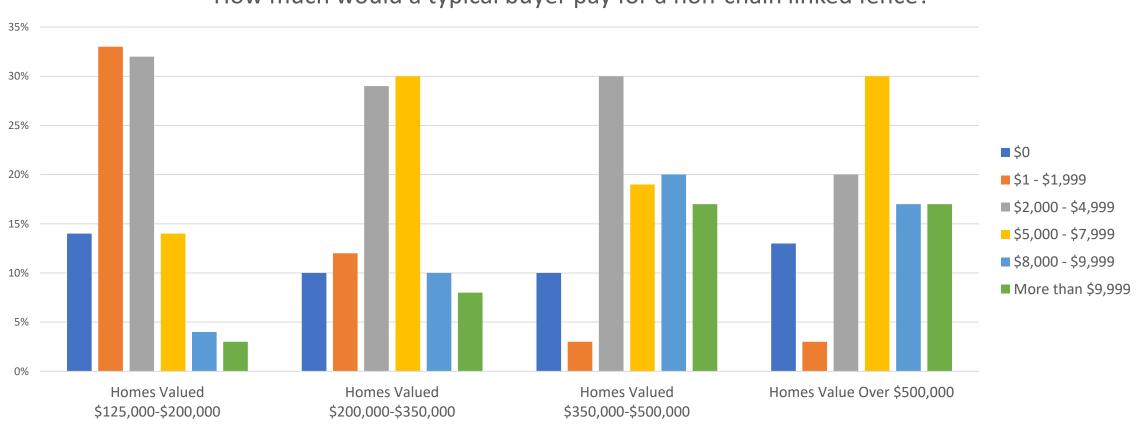
Finished Basement

How much would a typical buyer pay for finished basement space? (average quality, paneled walls, drop tile ceiling, lower grade flooring)



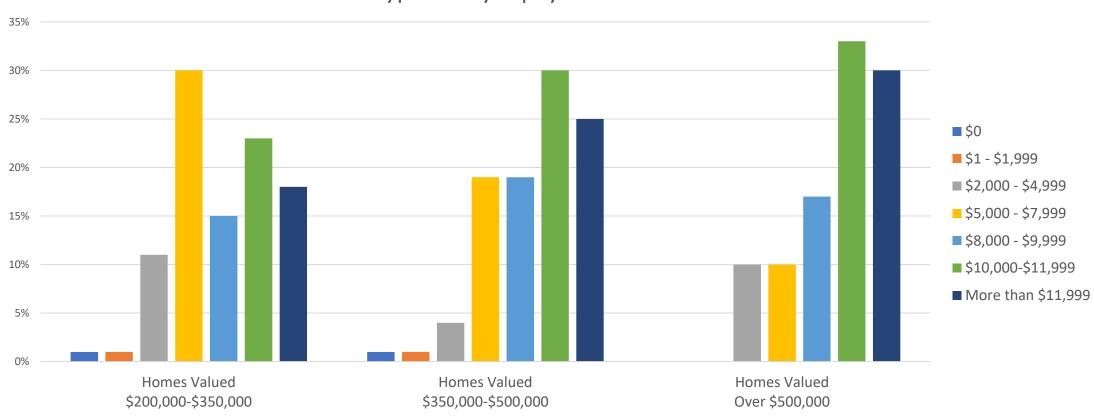
Fenced Back Yard

How much would a typical buyer pay for a non-chain linked fence?



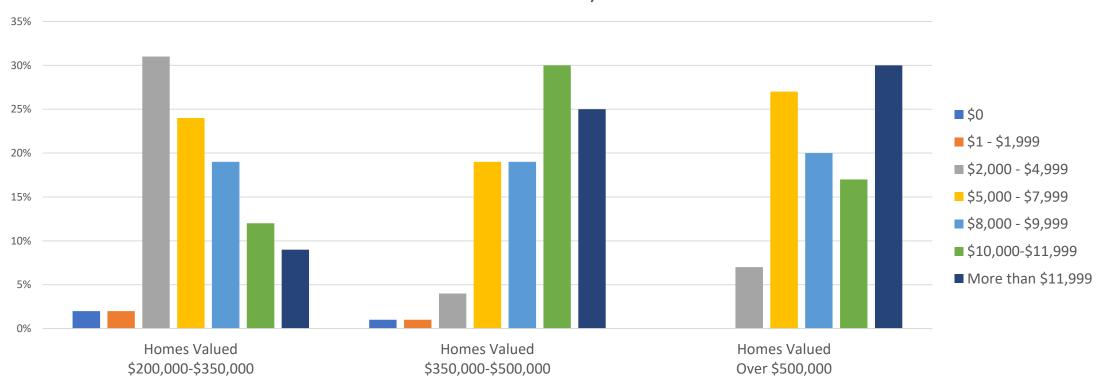
Three or Four Season Room

How Much would a typical buyer pay for a finished 3 or 4 seasons room?



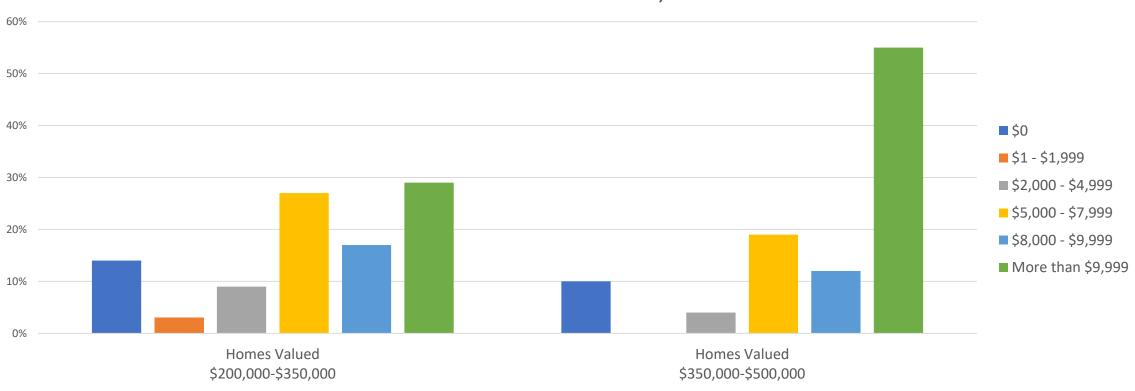
Deck or Patios

How Much would a typical buyer pay for a nice patio or deck? (good quality, 120+SF)



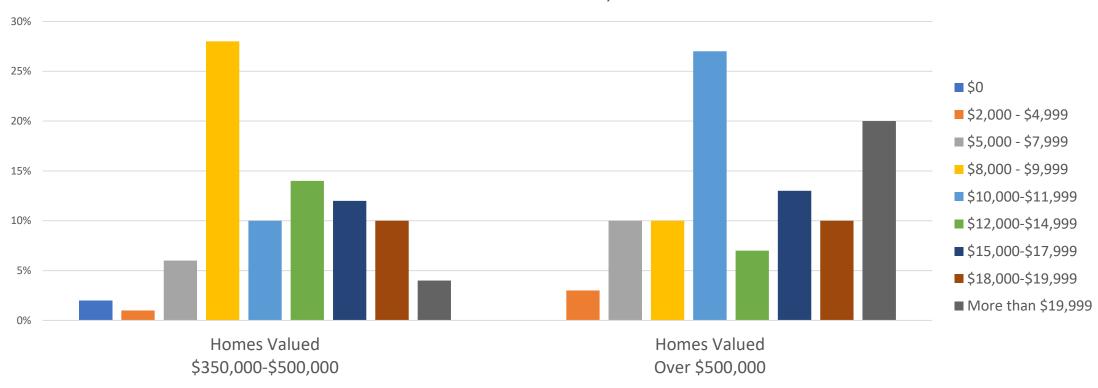
Pools
