

The dedication the teachers have to students in the honors and AP classes in incredible. The administration and school district itself do not care much, but the teachers do almost anything to help their students both in and out of school. The school adds new classes every year that are scarcely found in high schools, such as Women's Studies, four Philosophy Classes, and an International Business class. Overall, classes like these help to give students an advantage over other schools because the topics and curriculums more closely resemble college classes. However, the school's trimester system has tried to "even out" scores on standardized tests and overall grades. The system overall helps the lower level classes while inhibiting the honors and AP students to centralize the student body in academics. This major setback outweighs the highly talented arts and athletic programs, the teachers employed, and the classes offered.

Locally, Dallastown is one of the best schools in its area, if not the best school in its area. State-wide, it's pretty much average. The academics are generally good, and there are plenty of options for students who want to take college classes or Japanese or something. There are many programs that other schools don't have, like the JROTC program, a Speech and Debate team, a large music program, a Black Student Union, and a fairly good support network for LGBTQ students. A warning to political people: Dallastown is in Pennsyltucky, so the general student population is very conservative. The teachers, however, are pretty liberal, and in AP classes, the students are also mostly liberal. I think that the school has declined throughout the four years that I've been there. They switched from a semester schedule to a trimester schedule a few years ago, which was definitely a mistake, especially for AP students and students in the music program.
